God, your invitation to come and feast in your presence is but a taste of the love you extend to us every day. Pour out your Spirit on these gifts, O God - here in this chapel. Pour out your Spirit on the meal before those who gather with us virtually. Make

these ordinary elements into the Sacred gift of your presence with us once again. May they awaken us anew to your everlasting invitation into a life of resurrection. **Amen.**

We have a few COVID related options for those who wish to partake. If you wish to receive from the ministers, take an empty eco-friendly cup from the stack on the aisle table and approach the minister, who will place a piece of bread in your open hand. All bread is gluten free.
