Earned an accredited Master of Divinity degree or ministry elated or religious studies master's degree in an area related to the applicant's ministry setting or vocational calling. It is expected that such a master's degree will include the following core courses:

- Bible 6 credits (2 courses)
 3 credits in Introduction to New Testament
 3 credits in Introduction to Old Testament / Hebrew Bible
- Theology 6 credits (2 courses)
 3 credits in Theology
 3 credits in Ethics or a related elective
- History of Christianity 3 credits (1 course)
- Practical Theology 3 credits (1 course)
 Including pastoral care, pastoral counseling, worship, preaching, religious education.

Bring significant ministerial experience (usually 3-5 years) that enables the applicant to engage as a ministry peer with other students in an advanced professional doctorate program.

Possess the ability to thoughtfully interpret scripture and the theological tradition of the applicant's ministry context.

Ability to articulate a self-understanding of his/her/their ministerial identity and vocational calling.

Demonstrates the capacity to understand and adapt his/her/their ministry to the cultural context of the applicant's ministry and vocational setting.

Application materials presented by the applicant indicate a readiness to engage in ongoing personal and spiritual formation to deepen the applicant's ministry and vocational calling.
